- Manage a classroom of up to 15 elementary-aged students, (per half-day session) from 9am-4pm, Monday-Friday from November 22-24 & 26
- Organize materials, Evaluate and provide written report within 20 hours November 19-December 3
- Interact with parents at the start and end of each day to ensure they know what their child learned
- Create and implement supplemental hands-on STEM activities to extend the curriculum developed by the Education Department, if necessary
